





Foreword ...

HE compilation of this souvenir of Canon Dennett's Jubilee would not seem complete without some reference, necessarily brief, to the earlier history of our Faith in Maghull.

In pre-Reformation times, Maghull, Melling, and Kirkby had each a Catholic Church of ample dimensions. Came the days of persecution when attempts to root out the old Religion almost succeeded. Here, in Maghull, the remains of the old church are still extant in the Protestant churchyard and consist mainly of the Unsworth Chantry.



CONVENT OF MERCY

The Sisters came to Maghull, May 27th, 1940, and the School opened with forty pupils on September 17th. The First Mass was said in the Convent Chapel on December 7th. The Canon was the Celebrant, assisted by Fr. Harvey. Fr. Ramsbottom, Reverend Mother of the Mother-house (Mount Vernon) and thirty Sisters from the Branch Convents of Mercy were present at the Mass. St. Philomena's (Annexe) was opened May 4th, 1942.

HE large stone forming the doorstep at the entrance is said to have been the altar-stone of the old church. For almost three centuries the hunted, harassed local Catholics had to attend Mass by stealth and often at midnight. When relief came at last with Catholic Emancipation the faithful in Maghull had to go to Lydiate, Aughton, Gillmoss, or Netherton, and such distances naturally led to irregularity in attendance at Mass and a consequent weakening of faith.





ET these conditions prevailed for over half a century before the Holy Sacrifice was offered again in Maghull and it came about as follows. In 1886 a Father Massey, forced into retirement by ill-health, came to live at Maghull with his cousin, Mr. John Massey. Mr. Massey offered to fit up a room in which Father Massey could say Mass when able. Bishop O'Reilly consented and a barn was duly prepared in which some O'Reilly consented and a barn was duly prepared in which some 70 Catholics were present when Fr. Massey offered up the Holy Sacrifice on Sunday, 30th June, 1887, for the first time in Maghull since the so-called Reformation.

NDER Fr. Green, the barn, which still exists in Station Road, just past the parochial hall, became a quasi-parish church where Mass was said, the Sacraments administered, and the Gospel preached, from 4th September, 1887, which dates as the foundation of St. George's, Maghull. Soon the barn-chapel was not big enough and a larger barn and out-buildings were lent by Mr. Thos. Colgan. They were transformed into one building (now disappeared) which served as both chapel and school for a couple of years.

URING this period land had been secured and plans prepared for a School-Chapel and Teacher's House. On Rosary Sunday, 1889, Bishop O'Reilly laid the foundation stone and the school was opened the following May. In another month the First Mass was celebrated in the new building. The next item on Fr. Green's programme was to erect a Presbytery. He blessed its foundations in 1891 and on its completion took up his residence on 8th June, 1892, another red-letter day for the Catholics of Maghull, because from that date daily Mass commenced for them.

HIS year also saw Father Green's elevation to a stall in the Liverpool Cathedral Chapter, an honour deserved, for he had successfully coped with various diocesan duties. These latter made it necessary for him to have an assistant and the first one appointed arrived in 1894. Ill-health, death, and changes had accounted for four curates in four years when, in August, 1898, the Rev. Wm. Dennett came to Maghull.

CANON WILLIAM DENNETT

ANON DENNETT was born in Appleton, near Widnes, on 23rd March, 1868, and was baptised in St. Bede's Church, Appleton. After being educated at the Catholic Institute, Liverpool, and at St. Edward's College, he was retained as a Minor Professor at St. Edward's for five years. He was questioned as to his indication to the control of the con questioned as to his inclination to remain a sixth year. But as the decision was left to himself, he preferred to proceed with his studies for the priesthood.

HE President of St. Edward's promised to get him released from one year's Philosophy. But on entering Upholland College, he was placed with all the other students just beginning Philosophy. As the promise did not seem to be materializing he wrote to remind the President of St. Edward's about it after the first term.

Bishop O'Reilly was consulted, with the result that he said "Put him in *Theology.*" Omitting the study of Philosophy was not altogether to the liking of Dr. Whiteside, at that time President of Upholland.





OBVIOUS INTEREST—A STUDY AT THE JUBILEE CONCERT

O AFTER ordination to the Priesthood in June, 1895, he sent Canon Dennett (then Father Dennett), to the College of the Venerabile in Rome to attend the Gregorian University for the Study of Philosophy: slyly remarking "You see, you did not get off your Philosophy."

The privilege, however, was highly appreciated by Father Dennett who remained at Rome for nearly three years, obtaining the Licentiate in his second year.

CCOMPANYING the study of Philosophy a rapid course of Mathematics had to be taken. In the resulting examination Canon Dennett took first place among the students of various nationalities and was awarded the coveted distinction of the Silver Medal.

At the oral part of the mathematical examination he was asked to demonstrate a theorem in the third book of Euclid. Taking a piece of chalk he drew a perfect circle, free-hand, on the black-

board, which caused the professor, priest though he was, to throw out his arms and exclaim "Per Bacco! un Giotto" (By Bacchus, a Giotto).

HILST Father Dennett was at the Venerabile, the Beda College was formed, and when he and two other students shook hands—the Beda was in being, although it was sometime before it was housed in its own building.

However the strain of study and the climate compelled him to leave Rome in 1898.

Returning to England, he was appointed assistant to Canon Green at Maghull in August, 1898. Not only was he to help in the Parochial work but he was to be Assistant Diocesan Treasurer. His mathematical ability may have been the deciding factor in his being appointed to Maghull in the first instance, but it is a fact that his genius for figures has been put to good use by the diocese, for he eventually became Diocesan Treasurer, a post he retained until 1933.



HEN Canon Green died in 1901, Father Dennett succeeded him as Parish Priest of Maghull. As such he has remained to this day. With quiet unostentation he carried out his duties towards his flock and their needs, besides continuing his Diocesan work. Preparations for building a church steadily progressed all the time until in 1927 the Canon, who had been installed in the Liverpool Cathedral Chapter in 1922, had the satisfaction of seeing the foundation-stone laid by Archbishop Keating. The architects were Messrs. Pugin & Pugin, famous

designers of so many Catholic churches in this country, and the cost was round about £12,000. Its opening in 1929 was another red-letter day in the Catholic life of Maghull and the Canon's crowning achievement.

Meanwhile the Canon had been made Dean of a large rural district. In Maghull, the Catholic population increased so rapidly that it became necessary to increase the number of Masses on the Sunday. A hall for Catholic social events was erected but soon

was inadequate and just before the war a larger one displaced it at a cost of about £3,000.

Came the war, putting a stop to all progress, but still one event has to be recorded for those unhappy years. The Convent of Mercy was established almost opposite the Church in Station Road. Its school filled a long-felt want and it played an important part in the Canon's Golden Jubilee celebrations.


