AN ACT OF MEMORIAL OF THE DEAD IN THIS WAR.

Minister:

Let us remember all those who have suffered or died in this Great War, in humble hope that, through the redemption wrought by the Cross of Christ, their sacrifice will prove not to have been in vain, but will help towards the defeat of evil and the triumph of righteousness and the establishing of a righteous and enduring peace.

Names will be read.

Silence will be kept for a space during which each should say:—

In remembrance of those who made the great sacrifice, O God, make us better men and women, and give peace in our time.

Then shall be said aloud by all :-

"They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old, Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn, At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them."

O LORD Jesus Christ, strong Son of God and Captain of our salvation; Give thy grace to all those among us who served in the last Great War or are serving in this war. Make them valiant in the cause of righteoness and peace. Look in mercy upon any who are in difficulty or distress, and grant that by wise measures they may be relieved. Hear us, we humbly beseech Thee, and grant that in this our British Commonwealth Thy Kingdom may come and Thy will may be done, for Thy glory and for the welfare of our fellow men; and this we ask for Thy great Name's save. Amen.

O ALMIGHTY God, who rulest over all things in heaven and earth, we yield Thee praise and thanksgiving for our deliverance from those great dangers and grave evils wherewith we were compassed in the last War, and for the victories which have been won in this war. Give us grace and grant us the will to use this great mercy to Thy glory, the advancement of Thy Gospel, the honour of our Sovereign, and, as much as lieth in us, to the good of all mankind. And we beseech Thee, grant to all our Empire and our Allies such an abiding and deepening sense of this mercy that a true thankfulness may appear in our lives by an humble, righteous and obedient walking before Thee all our days, through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all glory and honour, world without end. Amen.
